


#### Senior 3 Star class:

In March, we started by talking about Dinosaurs and the Paleontologists who study them. We learned how dinosaurs lived their day-to-day lives and how they ultimately went extinct, and we made "Dinosaur Dirt Cups".

Next, we started our Butterfly unit to learn how they start developing from an egg to a caterpillar, then to a pupa to a butterfly. To show their newfound knowledge of butterflies, the Stars built example life cycles, and a huge butterfly (for you to find!). This led us to our Planting and Harvesting week's discussion from the seed to plant. We discussed the season in general and how it affects the plants and trees in our area. We continued discussing how we can grow plants and vegetables this summer and what we should be putting in our playground garden boxes.

To end the month, we talked about Spring and Spring Cleaning. The children always enjoy cleaning our classroom by washing toys, and they loved cooking rice with fresh vegetables.
