

During the month of December, we learned about different winter holidays. We had fun at the annual Winterfest singing and dancing with Mr. Jon, and the Dolphins each took a picture with the big snowman in the front lobby.

First, we learned about **Diwali** by exploring some clothing and bracelets that are worn during this holiday. We read books about Diwali and made a Diya for this festival of lights. During art, the children painted fireworks with cut paper towel rolls.

Next, we learned about **Kwanzaa**. We painted with the colors from the Kwanzaa flag... red, black, and green. We used corn kernels and made our very own shakers (and the toddlers enjoyed making noise with their shakers!).

Mid-month, we began our discussion on the **Christmas** holiday by reading books about reindeer and looking at Christmas holiday pictures. We sang *Jingle Bells*, and we painted paper plates to make a pine tree and painted ornaments.

Our last unit for December was **Chanukah**. We read some Chanukah stories and learned about the dreidel and menorah. We also explored Chanukah puzzles and a menorah. The children had fun painting with a dreidel and creating holiday placemats. Other favorite December activities include movement and dance. The Dolphins enjoyed dancing to *Walking*, *Walking*, *Baby Shark*, *Wheels on the Bus*, and *If You're Happy and You Know It*. We learned a new version of the song *Five Little Monkeys* called *Five Little Dolphins* (aka our new classroom theme song!).

Adeline, Rio, and Uma are enjoying their new room in JR 2. In December, we sent these friends next door to the Goldfish and welcomed one friend from the Monkeys.
