

#### Senior 1 Bear class:

In November, the Bears explored the theme: **People Around the World**. The children enjoyed learning about different cultures, traditions, languages, foods, and ways of life. We really enjoyed dancing to traditional music from various cultures, and reading books about America, Japan, Australia, and Mexico.

Next, we studied: **Animals in Fall**. The class observed how animals prepare for colder weather and discussed hibernation, migration, and other fascinating wild animal behaviors. Our favorite activity was making a bear cave inside our Bear classroom. The children were interested in learning what animals eat and where they live in fall. We also learned about the 3 States of Matter. The students participated in fun, handson experiments to learn about solids, liquids, and gases. They loved observing how ice melts from a solid into liquid water and heating the water to make gas bubbles. Finally, we reflected on **Thankfulness** as we discussed the importance of gratitude and the things we are thankful for in our lives during the Thanksgiving holiday week. Throughout November, we studied the letters K, L, M, & N, and the numbers 11, 12, 13, & 14. The children practiced writing and forming these symbols on construction paper using their finger. The Bears enjoyed the different activities to strengthen their letter and number recognition skills. Then, we all enjoyed sharing a Thanksgiving dessert of pumpkin pie with family members joining us in the classroom. In December, we are excited to dive into new themes on **Opposites**; **Outer Space**; Hello, Winter; and Holidays Around the World. For our letter study, we will practice the letters O, P, O, & R. For our review of numbers in December, we will focus on the numbers 15, 16, 17, & 18. We wish everyone a joyful holiday season.
