

Junior 1 Dolphin class:

During the month of January, we have been learning about winter!

First, we learned about **Numbers.** We practiced counting to 10 during circle time. We also made a counting caterpillar and apple trees with pom-poms on them. We sang our theme song *Five Little Dolphins*, and read books about numbers, like <u>Count the Monkeys</u> and 123 William Wegman.

Next, we learned about **Ice**. We had fun exploring ice and snow at the sensory table. We added some ocean animals, cups, and spoons to practice scooping. During art, we painted with colored ice cubes and painted on ice. The class loved saying the word "cold." We read a book called Ice and danced to *Freeze Dance*.

Mid-month, the class was introduced to **Snow.** During art, we painted roller skates and built a snowman with paper. We used bubble wrap to paint the snow in the background. We sang *Frosty the Snowman* and *Little Snowflake*. We also read Gus Makes a Friend. Towards the end of the month, we learned about **Polar Pals**. For art, they made a polar bear using cotton balls and made footprints using a penguin and a polar bear. The children enjoyed exploring our "Polar Pals" bin with foam icebergs and plastic animals. Our last January theme was Winter Clothes. The Dolphins painted and used crayons or markers to make a hat, sweater, and long pants. We read books about winter and checked to see what winter clothing the characters were wearing in each book. In January, the toddlers really enjoyed new songs, drawing with crayons, and painting with a brush and ice cubes, too. Our other favorite activities included movement and dance activities to Walking, Walking, Baby Bumblebee, Wheels on the Bus, If You're Happy and You Know It, and Five Little Dolphins. For large motor play, we all enjoyed going on walks outside, crawling through the tunnel, and climbing the stairs! In early January, Elijah and Max moved to the Goldfish class. Then towards the end of the month, we welcomed Evie and Ezra to the Dolphins room. In February, our themes will be **Post Office**, **Dental Health**, **Shapes**, and **Money**.

We had sticky fun with glue and cotton balls to make polar bears and we quickly noticed that it was hard to come off our hands. We enjoyed learning facts about different arctic animals. We made some penguins, Snowy owls, narwhals, and walruses too.

In January, we welcomed Elijah and Max to our fishbowl, and we had fun swimming around in the snowy and cold weather. We can't wait to jump into this upcoming month with some fun crafts and activities.

We plan on discussing diversity in our world for Black History month and the "Year of the Snake". Our themes for February will include the **Lunar New Year; My Sweet Valentine**; **Black History Month**; **President's Day**; and **Groundhog Day**. February here we come!

Senior 1 Bear class:

We began the month by discussing the New Year and its significance. The children shared their favorite memories from last year and goals for 2025, like being kind to friends, learning new things, and helping at home. To celebrate new beginnings, we created colorful firework art and read books welcoming the New Year around the world. Next, we explored the theme of "2D Shapes". The class identified and worked with circles, squares, triangles, rectangles, and more! The Bears practiced creating pictures using shape cutouts and enjoyed sorting, matching, and counting different shapes. We also went on a "Shape Scavenger Hunt" around the classroom, finding everyday objects that match various 2D shapes.

The class then zoomed into the world of "Transportation". We learned about vehicles that move on land, in the air, and on water. We read books about cars, boats, and airplanes. The children enjoyed hands-on activities, like creating a paper ship or boat to float on water, and crafting paper airplanes to fly into the air.

Finally, we traveled to the icy world of the "Arctic" to study animals that live in colder climates. The children learned about polar bears, penguins, seals, and Arctic foxes. We learned how their adaptations help them survive. The students put polar bears in the water to freeze and played with snow in the classroom.

In January, we studied the numbers 19 & 20 and reviewed 1-20. Our January letters were S, T, U, & V. January was a month filled with discovery, creativity, and joy. We look forward to the new adventures that February will bring. Our weekly themes will be about **Money**, **Friendship**, **3D Shapes**, and **Weather**.
