# Junior 1 Dolphin class:

During the month of March, we read many books and had fun decorating our door based on one of our favorites, <u>The Very Hungry Caterpillar</u>. The Dolphins loved drawing with crayons or painting with a brush. Other favorite activities included movement, music, and dance. The toddlers enjoyed dancing to *Walking*, *Walking*, *Baby Bumblebee*, *Wheels on the Bus*, and *The Elmo Song*. We learned a new song in March called *Rubber Ducky*, *You're the One*. The children had fun going on walks outside, crawling through the tunnel on the playground, and climbing the steps!

First, we discussed **Wind.** During art, we made kites and hot air balloons. We brought the kites outside to watch them blow in the wind. We read <u>The Wind Blew</u>, <u>Kites</u>, and <u>Wind</u>. The children enjoyed the wind blowing in the trees and in their hair.

Next, we learned about **Farm Animals.** During art, the students made pigs and chicks. They played with the barn using farm animals, while making animal sounds. We read <u>Busy, Noisy Farm</u> and <u>Old McDonald Had a Farm</u>. We also sang *Old McDonald Had a Farm* and *Farm Animals*.

Mid-month, the class was introduced to **Rainbows.** With bubble wrap, we painted beautiful and colorful rainbows. Then, we also painted a fish using celery! We read <u>I</u> <u>Love You Like a Rainbow</u> and <u>Bear Sees Colors</u>. The toddlers enjoyed climbing on our rainbow mat and practiced naming the colors.

Towards the end of the month, we explored the color, **Green**. The children painted green leaves with spring flowers. We brought in different green fruits and vegetables for the children to touch and taste.

In April, our themes will be **Rain & Puddles**, **Zoo**, **Week of the Young Child**, **and Spring Cleaning**.

Our Dr. Seuss week was a success... we love books!

For the center-wide "Battle of the Books", we used the book <u>Chicka Chicka Boom</u> Boom as our battle book entry and for our door decoration. Our Goldfish enjoyed reading each book and voting for their favorites.

Once the book was chosen and our door was decorated, we moved onto our spring theme to get ready to welcome spring. We made flowers and we turned our crafting materials into more designs such as butterflies and more flowers. We painted "Mr. Sun" and used our handprints for the rays.

For our St. Patrick's Day theme, we painted cardboard to make a pot of gold. Then, we painted gold to fill our pots. The class also made clovers to put up here and there, and we danced to Irish jigs. We put on Irish Celtic music to accompany us during our nap time to calm our bodies to rest and sleep.

For our rainbow theme, we started by making lava lamps in rainbow colors. We used magic watercolor paints and food coloring in the water. We added oil to the water to see the colors break apart and move around in the bottle. We used pipettes to make a rainbow design on napkins. Our rainbow designs were amazing to see once it dried up! We had an amazing month filled with books, books, and more books!

Our theme for April will revolve around spring cleaning, which we take time for our friends to clean the classroom and then start on our biweekly toy cleaning as a team. # Senior 1 Bear class:

March has been a fun-filled month of exploration, creativity, and hands-on learning! Dr. Seuss week kicked off the month. We celebrated his birthday and his classics. The Bears enjoyed <u>The Cat in the Hat; Green Eggs and Ham;</u> and <u>One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish</u>. We practiced rhyming words, created our own silly Dr. Seuss-inspired creatures, and even made a fun Green Eggs and Ham craft.

For Seasons week, we explored the seasons and discussed how they change throughout the year. The children learned about different types of weather, what we wear in each season, and how nature transforms over time. We created seasonal artwork, including fall leaves, winter snowflakes, spring flowers, and summer sunshine. The Bears also enjoyed sorting objects and clothing that belong to each season.

Next, as spring began, we started looking for Signs of Spring. The children learned about blooming flowers, chirping birds, baby animals, and warmer days. We painted bright spring flowers, talked about how trees start to grow new leaves, and went on a "Spring Hunt" around the classroom to spot signs of the changing season.

We wrapped up the month by leaping into the world of Frogs! The children explored the frog life cycle, from eggs to tadpoles to adult frogs. We read <u>Five Green and Speckled Frogs</u>, practiced hopping like frogs, and created fun frog crafts. The Bears also learned about where frogs live, what they eat, and how they make their croaking sound. We continued our weekly review of counting numbers and Letters A-Z. Our April themes will be **Birds**, **The Week of Young Child**, **3-D Shapes**, and **Taking Care of the Earth**. March was a month filled with discovery and excitement. 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# Senior 2 Giraffe class:

March came and went with many exciting things happening throughout the month! To start, the Giraffes had fun celebrating Dr. Seuss' birthday by wearing the Cat in the Hat's hat and reading many books written by Dr. Seuss. We connected our weekly theme of "Pets" to the celebration by talking about different pets that show up in his books. The children also worked very hard to decorate our door based on our book choice, "The Three Little Pigs". The children created houses made of straw, sticks, and bricks along with the faces of the three pigs and the big bad wolf. They were so proud of their collaborative work and were showing it off to their parents!

For our "Farm Animals" theme, the children had fun talking and singing about farm animals. We traced animal shapes to paint with watercolors and painted with cotton balls. They also enjoyed a visit from Ms. Kelly, the librarian, who read <u>There Is a Monster in Your Book</u>. She asked the children to help her get the monster out of her book, and they had fun pretending to tickle, blow, and wiggle for the monster to leave. Next, the class welcomed a local author who came to read her book, <u>My Amazing Grandfriend</u>. The class had a great time listening to the story and sharing about their grandparents with the author. The Giraffes also learned about leprechauns and about "Forest Animals" that week. They turned marshmallows into gold with yellow paint and made forest animal collages and paintings.

To end the month, we talked about "Zoo Animals". The Giraffes loved sharing about their favorite zoo animals (like hippos, lions, monkeys, sloths, cheetahs, bears, raccoons, and moose). They did the animal movements to the song, "Let's Go to the Zoo" and enjoyed pretending to be a zookeeper.

In April, the Giraffes will stay busy ... dressing up "Inside Out" for April Fool's Day and riding the trikes for the St. Jude's Trike-a-Thon. Our April themes will include: "NAEYC's *Week of Young Child*", "In the Garden", "Spring", "Birds & Ocean Animals", and "Insects & Spiders".

#### Senior 3 Star class:

We started the month of March learning about the author and reading some books by Dr. Seuss. First, we read <u>The Foot Book</u> and made art based on this book to decorate our door. Next, we enjoyed the story <u>Green Eggs and Ham</u> and made a dessert that looked like the illustrations in the book.

Our next topic was Dinosaurs with discussions on Paleontologists. We looked at how dinosaurs lived day-to-day and how they went extinct. We made "Dinosaur Dirt Cups". During our spring unit, we learned about planting and harvesting from seed to vegetable. We discussed the spring season in general and how it affects the plants and trees in our area. The class is excited to grow plants and vegetables for the upcoming summer and we discussed what we should be putting in our gardens. To end the week, we woke up our hibernating animals that we put to "bed" back in October.

The following week, we talked more about spring, focusing on spring cleaning. We cleaned our classroom and washed toys in the sensory table. We read books on spring cleaning. In addition, we cooked basmati rice with mixed vegetables.

To end the month, we had our butterfly unit. We examined how they develop from an egg to a caterpillar, a caterpillar to a pupa, then a pupa to a butterfly. The children reviewed the life cycle stages for a butterfly while reading books. Then each student made their own butterfly life cycle showing each stage.

April themes will be "Week of the Young Child", Insects & Bugs, Earth Day & Recycling, Rainbows, and Rain & Puddles. We will also review the Letters of the Week (Y, S, H, J, F) and the Numbers of the Week (1-31).

We said goodbye to Logan in late March and to Teddy in early April. We hope that the next chapter of their lives will be filled with curiosity and happiness.
